
Accelerating Circular Economy through Circular Procurement

Why Circular Procurement?

Circular Procurement considers the whole life-cycle of goods and services, in order to avoid negative environmental impacts and waste creation, and achieve an overall reduction in the amount of energy and materials consumed.

Including circular principles in procurement helps procurers take a more holistic approach to sustainability and accelerate the transition of supply chains to a more circular economy.

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How ProCirc contributes

ProCirc is set up to experiment, implement and learn about circular procurement. We do this by:



Initiating and supporting more than 30 circular procurement pilots. Each pilot aims to reduce the use of 20-25% raw materials, waste and CO2 emissions.



Developing a Circular Procurement Framework Consisting of Minimum Circularity Requirements, Transnational Implementation Roadmaps, a Circular Procurement Toolbox and policy recommendations.



Organising a Transnational Procurer-to-**Procurer Learning and Action Programme** Circular Procurement expert task forces, Transnational and cross-industry Communities of Practice.
