The new instrument of the ERDF aims to strengthen economic cohesion in the EU by helping businesses work with innovation actors in other regions.


Funding & Tenders Portal

- All calls for proposals are published in the <u>F&T portal</u>
- The Online Manual contains all the guidance needed to apply to a call.
- The <u>IT Helpdesk</u> can be contacted to solve issues related to the submission tools.
- Before applying, your organisation needs to be registered in the <u>Participant Register</u> and receive a <u>Partner Identification Code</u> (PIC)



Call for proposals (I)


All calls will appear on the right part of the screen, including "Calls for proposals" (managed by the EU) and "Cascade funding", calls launched by EU-funded projects





Call for proposals (II)



Topic description and conditions

The topic description summarises the main elements of the call, but the full text is to be found in the **Call Document**.





Call document

The call document explains:

- ✓ Objective of the call,
- ✓ Activities to be funded,
- ✓ Available budget,
- √ Co-financing rates,

- ✓ Timetable and deadlines,
- ✓ Eligibility conditions,
- √ Award criteria
- ✓ Cost eligibility


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
Templates

- The call webpage contains application templates for information only!!!
- The ones to be used are the ones available for download in the submission tool







Submission tool


- You need to create the proposal on the submission tool. Any other method for sending proposals is not accepted.
- Both, Part A and Part B have to be fully completed and consistent.





Evaluation

- All calls are evaluated by external experts.
- Proposals are evaluated as submitted (not on their potential) and exclusively on the evaluation criteria defined in the call document.





Some tips

Don't Do Use the right template Do not modify **non-editable parts** of the Choose the right type of call template Link clearly the call to the policy Do not modify **titles/headings** of the framework "Award criteria" Be **consistent** throughout the call text Avoid the use of **terms not clearly** Each part of the application under the defined, e.g. "public authority" right section Do not use terms such as "procurer" or "normally" Establish a **REALISTIC timeline** ALWAYS avoid repetition to avoid Use **clear definitions** inconsistencies Define realistic and measurable **KPIs**
