What is **PAYT?**

Pay-as-you-throw tariff schemes (PAYT) are based on the "polluters-pay principle". They charge waste producers on the basis of the actual amount of waste generated and provide incentives for the collection of recuclable waste and the reduction of mixed waste. The effect of PAYT is to make waste prevention, reuse and better separation at source for recycling more economically attractive, increasing the waste producer's responsibility.

PAYT schemes are included in the Annex IVa of the new Waste Framework Directive (Directive (EU) 2018/851), among the examples of economic instruments and other measures to provide incentives for the application of the waste hierarchy [article 4 (3)].

What is **KAYT?**

Know-as-you-throw (KAYT) is an innovative concept developed by the Horizon 2020 Waste4think project to reduce municipal waste through a knowledge & persuasion-driven approach. KAYT can be seen as an additional instrument to PAYT, or as a simpler and easier alternative to it.

The idea: the habits of waste producers towards separate collection can be improved simply by informing them in a continuous and convenient way, combining technology (messages via apps, gamification, etc.), one-to-one meetings with real informers and some economic and/or social benefits.

KAYT is highlighted in the report of the European Commission "Best Environmental Management Practice for the Waste Management Sector" (June 2018).

What will REthinkWASTE do?



The new waste legislation (directive (EU) 2018/850 and directive (EU) 2018/851) sets new targets on municipal waste:

• 65% in weight of preparing for reuse and recycling by 2035;

• maximum 10% sent to landfill by 2035.

Improving waste management at local level has a huge potential for saving resources and moving towards circular economy: in this regard, innovative governance instruments such as "Pay-as-you-throw" (PAYT) and "Know-as-you-throw" (KAYT) can lead to impressive results.



• Produce a **Catalogue of recent practices in PAYT and KAYT**, through a **Mirror Group** with main EU projects/cases.

• Test the innovative concept of KAYT side by side with the PAYT approach in 4 Pilot Areas (3 municipalities in Italy, 1 in Spain) with different implementation schemes, evaluate the environmental, economic and social results, permanently incorporate the PAYT and KAYT paradigm within the municipal waste management regulations.

• Run LCA (Life Cycle Analysis) and LCC (Life-Cycle Cost Analysis) that will help Pilot Areas to assess the environmental footprint of the new waste regulations including PAYT-KAYT.

 Provide about 230 municipalities in the EU with customizable waste governance strategies, service schemes and business plans (through DSS + PAYT empowerment toolkit + focused training/coaching).
We want to trigger a change in mindset among policy-makers and civil bureaucracy, which will in turn spark a shift from traditional tariff systems (fixed cost*user) to a variable one (PAYT), combined with a pioneering informative and persuasion approach (KAYT).
